## SYNOPSIS

HIMALAYA SONG is a 45 minute multimedia performance that incorporates live storytelling, music and film to examine the Himalayas as they undergo major environmental and ecological change. It had its world premiere at the 2012 Sundance Film Festival with sold out performances. It was chosen as one of the Top 10 Music Films by Rolling Stone Magazine.



HIMALAYA SONG includes narration and video by Mridu Chandra and musical performances by Gingger Shankar (vocals and double violin) and Dave Liang (keyboards) of the electronic group The Shanghai Restoration Project.





## We think of HIMALAYA SONG as an 'ode' to the Himalayas.

### STORY

The story engages audiences through a fictional character Anya living in the near future. She goes on a search for her mother in her homeland of the Himalayan mountains and comes across various intersections of climate science and Hindu and Buddhist approaches to nature. Everything that she does and everything that happens to her is based on factual research from current events and news about climate change in the Himalayas. As such, our project changes and transforms as we perform it over time.

### STRUCTURE

The structure of the performance alternates between original musical compositions and live storytelling segments, with accompanying video for the entire duration.

### MUSIC

The music transports audiences to the Himalayas, exploring the intersection of modern sounds and ancient Indian and Chinese instruments.

### VIDEO

The projected video is crafted from materials created by traditional artists (painters/illustrators), computer artists, scholars, NGOs, climate scientists, travelers, and people who think about the Himalayas all over the world.

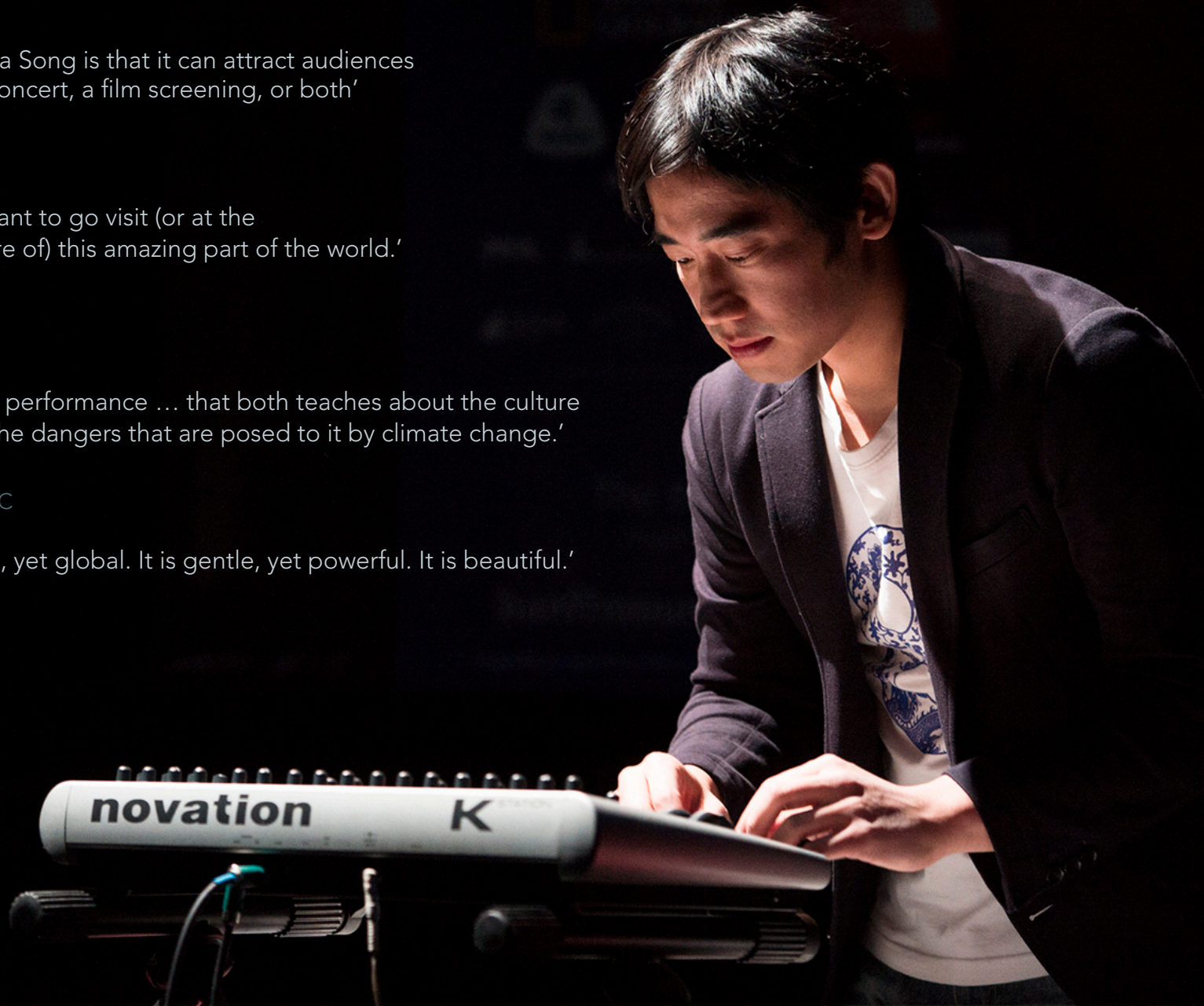
